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
STUDY SERIOUSLY FROM DIFFERENT ANGLES

His Divine Grace A. C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada

If you get knowledge, automatically *tapasyā* will follow, and then you will make advancement in spiritual life. So to get knowledge is the first item for anyone who is hoping to find his perfection of life. Therefore, I advise you to daily read our books as far as possible and try to understand the subject matter from different angles of vision by discussing frequently with the devotees at the New York temple. (Letter to Bob, 16 June 1972)

Therefore, I recommend you to read our books more and more and try to understand the subject matter from different angles of vision and be always discussing it with your god brothers even while you are working at the press, and when you are working and you cannot read, then listen to the tapes of my lectures and hear in that way. (Letter to Bhargava, 13 June 1972)

I am very much stressing nowadays that my students shall increase their reading of my books and try to understand them from different angles of vision. Each śloka can be seen from many, many angles of vision, so become practiced in seeing things like this. If we are selling the books but we do not know what is inside the book, then that will be a farce, especially if you are preaching and selling books to the students of Edinburgh. I am very much stressing at this point that all of my students shall be very much conversant with the philosophy of Krishna consciousness, and that they should read our books very diligently at least one or two hours daily and try to understand the subject matter from varieties of angles. We are holding our morning class in Los Angeles in the temple and I am speaking from 7 to 8 am, and the process is that we are going through some chapters of Śrīmad Bhāgavatam by taking one śloka each day, and reading the Sanskrit aloud. Each word is pronounced by me and repeated by the students and then all

together we chant the śloka several times until we have learned it. And then we discuss the subject matter very minutely and inspect it from all angles of approach and savor the new understandings. So you introduce this system in all of the centers in your zone and you will discover that everyone becomes very much enlivened by these daily classes. Read one śloka and discuss and then go on to the next śloka on the next day, and so on, and even you discuss one verse each day it will take you fifty years to finish the Śrīmad Bhāgavatam in this way. So we have got ample stock for acquiring knowledge. And if the students get knowledge more and more, they will automatically become convinced and very easily perform their duties for tapasyā or renunciation of the material bondage, and that will be their successful advancement in Krishna consciousness. So I want that advancement amongst all of my students, so you are responsible that the standard will be maintained. (Letter to Madhudvisa, 16 June 1972)

Your first job should be to make sure that every one of the devotees in your zone of management is reading regularly our literature and discussing the subject matter seriously from different angles of seeing, and if they are somehow or other absorbing the knowledge of Krishna consciousness philosophy. If they are fully educated in our philosophy and if they can get all of the knowledge and study it from every viewpoint, then very easily they will perform *tapasyā* (renunciation) and that will be their advancement in Krishna consciousness. (Letter to Satsvarupa, 16 June 1972)

So especially you must encourage the students to read our books throughout the day as much as possible, and give them all good advice how to understand the books, and inspire them to study the things from every point of view. In this way, by constantly engaging our tongues in the service of the Lord, either by discussing his philosophy or by chanting Hare Krishna, the truth is that Krishna himself will reveal himself to us and we shall understand how to do everything properly. (Letter to Hamsaduta, 22 June 1972)

Yes, this program is very nice to try to attract the attention of the students seriously. That will be a great success. They should put intelligent questions and they should be answered properly with reference to modern science and philosophy. That will be very much convincing. I think if you read our books thoroughly you will get a supply of material to answer all the questions. Now I am preparing one book answering all types of philosophical arguments. Every morning, Shyamsundar is putting questions from different angles of vision beginning from Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, etc. and we are trying to answer. We shall discuss also Marx philosophy of communism. It will require some time but I wish that all our preachers should be well versed with all philosophical ideas and after studying all philosophical points of view we will put Krishna Conscious philosophy on the top. THE GLORIES OF BHAGAVAD-GITA from the Hari-bhakti-vilāsa 6.214-228

skānde avantī-khaṇḍe śrī-vyāsoktau – gītā sugītā kartavyā kim anyaiḥ śāstra-vistaraiḥ yā svayam padma-nābhasya mukha-padmād viniḥsṛtā

In the *Skanda-purāṇa*, Srila Vyasadev says, "Memorize and sing sweetly this *Bhagavad-gītā*. What need is there to elaborate on other scriptures? She has descended directly from the lotus mouth of Lord Padmanabh."

sarva-śāstra-mayī gītā sarva-deva-mayī yataḥ sarva-dharma-mayī yasmāt tasmād etām samabhyaset

The *Bhagavad-gītā* contains the essence of all literatures. It is the sum total of all the demigods and the sum total of all religion. Therefore, one should study the *Bhagavad-gītā* thoroughly.

śālagrāma-śilāgre tu gītādhyāyam pathet tu yaḥ manvantara-sahasrāṇi vasate brahmaṇaḥ pure One who recites a chapter from the *Bhagavad-gītā* in front of a *śālagrāma-śilā* resides for a thousand *manvantaras* in Lord Brahma's abode.

hatvā hatvā jagat sarvain muṣitvā sa-carācaram pāpair na lipyate caiva gītādhyāyī kathañcana

One who reads the *Bhagavad-gītā* is not touched by sin even by repeatedly killing or plundering the whole world with its moving and non-moving entities.

teneştanı kratubhih sarvair dattanı tena gavāyutam gītām abhyasyatā nityanı tenāptanı padam avyayam

Such a person attains the result of donating ten thousand cows and the result of conducting all Vedic sacrifices. Those who constantly study the *Bhagavad-gītā* attain to the eternal spiritual world.

gītādhyāyam pathed yas tu ślokam ślokārdham eva vā bhava-pāpa-vinirmukto yāti viṣṇoḥ param padam

By reading a chapter, a verse or even half a verse from the *Bhagavad-gītā*, one is liberated from all sins and attains the topmost destination of Lord Vishnu's planets.

yo nityani viśva-rūpākhyam adhyāyani paṭhati dvijaḥ vibhūtini deva-devasya tasya puṇyani vadāmy aham

A brahmin who studies the tenth and eleventh chapter of the *Bhagavad-gītā* attains the following result [as described in the next verse].

vedair adhītair yat puṇyam setihāsaiḥ purātanaiḥ ślokenaikena tat puṇyam labhate nātra samśayaḥ ābrahma-stamba-paryantam jagat-tṛptim karoti saḥ viśva-rūpam sadādhyāyam vibhūtim ca paṭhet tu yaḥ

By studying a single verse from these two chapters one attains the same result as studying all the Vedas,



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Itihāsas and *Purāṇas*, of which there is no doubt. One who studies the tenth and eleventh chapters enjoys all pleasures enjoyed by all living entities — from the ordinary blades of grass up to Lord Brahma.

ahany ahani yo martyo gītādhyāyam pathet tu vai dvātrimśad-aparādhāms tu kṣamate tasya keśavaḥ

Lord Keshava forgives all thirty-two kinds of offenses for a mortal who recites a chapter of the *Bhagavad-gītā*.

likhitvā vaiṣṇavānām ca gītā-śāstram prayacchati dine dine ca yajate harim cātra na samśayaḥ

There is no doubt that those who copy and gift this literature to the devotees of the Lord attain the same result as worshiping Lord Hari daily.

caturṇām eva vedānām sāram uddhṛtya viṣṇunā trailokyasyopakārāya gītā-śāstram prakāśitam

For the benefit of the three worlds, Lord Vishnu has extracted the essence of the four Vedas and manifested that essence in the form of the literature known as *Bhagavad-gītā*.

bhāratāmṛta-sarvasvam viṣṇor vaktrād viniḥsṛtam gītā-gaṅgodakam pītvā punar janma na vidyate

Everything in the *Mahābhārata* has emanated from the mouth of Lord Vishnu. Those who drink the Ganges-like water of the *Bhagavad-gītā* do not take birth again in the material world.

dharmanı cārthanı ca kāmanı ca mokṣanı cāpīcchatā sadā śrotavyā paṭhanīyā ca gītā kṛṣṇa-mukhodgatā

Those who desire religiosity, economic development, sense gratification, or liberation should always hear, study and sing the *Bhagavad-gītā*, which has emanated from the mouth of Lord Krishna.

yo naraḥ paṭhate nityam gītā-śāstram dine dine vimuktaḥ sarva-pāpebhyo yāti viṣṇoḥ param padam

The person who constantly reads the *Bhagavad-gītā* day after day gets liberated from all sins and attains Lord Vishnu's abode.
